





- 4. The granting of the variance will not have the effect of preventing the orderly development of other land in the area in accordance with the provisions of this chapter, and
- 5. There are special or unique circumstances or conditions affecting the land involved such that the strict application of the provisions of this chapter would deprive the applicant of the reasonable use of the property.





## ORDINANCE NO. 040925\*A

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HOLLAND, TEXAS ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS RELATED TO TRUCK TRAFFIC ON PUBLIC STREETS DESIGNATED AS NO THROUGH TRUCK STREETS; PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION OF SIGNS; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City of Holland, Texas has the authority to regulate heavy truck traffic on the public roadways of the City pursuant to Texas law, including section 311.002 of the Texas Transportation Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that city streets are designed and built to handle specific types of traffic; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that commercial vehicles, due to their size and weight, can cause damage to streets that are not designed for commercial traffic; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to prohibit through truck traffic and finds that the prohibition of through truck traffic on the streets designated herein will help to prolong the operational life of public streets; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of its citizens to prohibit through truck traffic on certain streets within the City.

# NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOLLAND, TEXAS:

**Section 1. Findings.** The findings set out herein are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted by the City Council and made a part of this Ordinance for all purposes.

**Section 2. Definitions.** The following words, terms and phrases when used in this ordinance shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates different meaning. Terms not defined herein shall be construed in accordance with customary usage.

Authorized emergency vehicle means fire department trucks, police trucks, public ambulances for which permits have been issued by the State Board of Health, emergency trucks of municipal departments or public service corporations as are designated or authorized by the governing body of an incorporated city, private trucks operated by volunteer firemen or certified emergency medical volunteers while answering a fire alarm or responding to a medical emergency, and trucks owned by the state or by a political subdivision engaged in emergency utility repair or electric, water, or wastewater services.

Commercial vehicle means any vehicle, with a gross vehicle weight in excess of 10,000 pounds or carrying capacity exceeding one ton and used for the delivery of passengers, tools, materials, or livestock. A Recreational Vehicle, herein, is not considered a commercial vehicle.

Light truck means any truck with a manufacturer's rated carrying capacity of two thousand (2,000) pounds or less, including trucks commonly known as pickup trucks, panel delivery trucks, and carryall trucks.

No Through Truck Street means a city street where Truck Traffic is prohibited.

*Proof of route* means a written verification of pick-ups, deliveries, or destinations, which may include a logbook, delivery slip, shipping order, bill or any other document which identifies and specifies the date, address, and name of the person requesting or directing the pick-up or delivery and the destination of the pick up or delivery.

Recreation vehicle means personal vehicles such as boats and boat trailers, watercraft and watercraft trailers, travel trailers, pickup campers or coaches (designed to be mounted on automotive vehicles), and motorized dwellings (RV).

Truck means any motor vehicle designed, used or maintained primarily for the transportation of property, including "truck tractors," "road tractors," "trailers," "semi-trailers," "pole trailers," and "special mobile equipment" as those terms are defined in Texas Transportation Code Annotated §541.201 and includes a Commercial Vehicle as defined in this Ordinance.

*Truck traffic* means the operation of any Commercial Vehicle including but not limited to a Truck, truck tractor or combination of any truck, truck tractor, trailer, or semitrailer that are considered commercial vehicles. The operation of a Recreational Vehicle is not considered to be truck traffic.

# Section 3. No Through Truck Traffic Streets Designated.

Through Truck Traffic is prohibited on the following streets:

Dixie St, Hogan, Harper, Sumbera, Pegram, Towery, Parsonage Dr, North Rose, Crockett, Hackberry, El Paso, West Travis, South Lexington, Romberg Lane, Katy, Sherly, Brenda, South Austin, Shelly, Latham Circle, North Austin, North and South Front, Center, Milam, Live Oak, Leon, Kelley, Old Vilas, East Travis, Holland Cemetery Road, Barbara Hill Drive, West Travis (From the Post Office to Shannon Lane), Shannon Lane. Josephine (From N Lexington to North Front.)

# Section 4. Through Truck Traffic Prohibited.

No person shall operate a Truck upon any city street designated as a No Through Truck Street. A person commits an offense if the person operates a Truck upon a city street designated as a No Through Truck Street.

# Section 5. Exemptions and Affirmative Defenses.

- A. The provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to:
  - 1. An authorized emergency vehicle in response to any emergency call;
  - 2. A vehicle operated by a public utility in the assigned area for the purpose of inspecting the facilities of the public utility or providing maintenance service to such facilities.

- 3. Municipal and county vehicles performing city and county business and services, school buses and church buses.
- B. The following provision is an affirmative defense to prosecution if the Truck:
  - 1. was being driven to seek service or repairs at a facility that engages in the business or repairs of commercial motor vehicles or the truck was being driven to or from home or to fulfill a local commercial obligation to a buyer or seller at a given destination, evidenced by a bill of sale, invoice or other proof of route which shall be displayed immediately upon request; and
  - 2. the public street was the only route to such a destination.

# Section 6. Installation of Signs.

The City Council authorizes and directs the Mayor to have signs installed on the Streets named in Section 3, warning the public that Truck Traffic is prohibited to drive upon the listed streets.

# Section 7. Penalty.

Any person who shall violate any provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined in an amount not more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) per offense or the maximum amount permitted by law. Each day of violation shall constitute a separate offense.

**Section 8. Cumulative Clause.** This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of the City, except where the provisions of this Ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such Ordinance, in which event the conflicting provisions of such Ordinance are hereby repealed.

**Section 9. Severability.** It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council of the City that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance should be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of the Ordinances, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without incorporation in this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrases, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

## Ordinance No. 042825\*B

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HOLLAND, TEXAS REQUIRING NEW AND EXISITING BUSINESSES OPERATING WITHIN THE CITY TO OBTAIN A BUSINESS OPERATION PERMIT: PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF CERTAIN INFORMATION TO OBTAIN A BUSINESS OPERATION PERMIT; PROVIDING A PENALTY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CONFLICTING **ORDINANCES CLAUSE:PROVIDING** SAVINGS: SEVERABILITY; AND MEETINGS CLAUSES: AND PROVIDING FOR SAID ORDINANCE TO TAKE EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS DATE OF PUBLICATION.

WHEREAS, the goal of furthering economic development involves the City Council being able to rely upon accurate and up to date information as to the type and number of businesses operating within the City;

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that it is reasonable and necessary to require businesses operating within the City to obtain business permits to enable the City, the City Council, and city staff with a reliable source of information on the businesses operating within the City and that such requirements further and benefit the public welfare, property values, economy and quality of life within the City;

WHEREAS, information about the operation of businesses within the City and burdens upon and needs of such businesses upon water and wastewater and other services provided by the City and the needs for future such services, further benefits the general health, safety and welfare of the City, its residents, property values and quality of life within the City;

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOLLAND, TEXAS, TUAT:

- **Section 1. Findings of Fact.** That the above and foregoing recitals are found to be true and correct and are made a part of this ordinance for all purposes.
- Section 2. Requirement of Business Operation Permit. The City Council deems it in the best interest of the City to require business operation permits for all business establishments located within the limits of the City of Holland.
- Section 3. Business Operation Permit Application. (a) In order to obtain a business operation permit, the authorized representative of the business must complete a Business Permit Application which shall be made available by the City Secretary.
- (b) Application Requirements. The Applicant must provide the following information as part of the Business Operation Permit Application:

- (1) proof of authority to submit the application.
- (2) information as to whether the business is incorporated or any other business entity.
- (3) a description of the type and nature of the business; and
- (4) if required under the law, a copy of the business sales tax certificate.
- (5) Copy of any other required licenses. (Ex TABC, Health department certificate, Fire Marshall inspection)
- Section 4. Business Operation Permit Fee. There shall be no permit or application fee for the business operation permit required by this ordinance. The permits will be issued by the city staff upon receipt of all required information. Any business permit issued to a business after January to an established business firm is subject to a fine.
- Section 5. No Substitute for Required Licensing or Permits. No permit issued by the City pursuant to the requirements of this ordinance shall be in lieu of or a substitute for any license or permit required by any other Federal, State, or county government. Businesses are required to obtain or maintain their own licenses or permits in accordance with the laws or regulations under which those licenses or permits are issued, granted, or renewed.
- Section 6. Penalty. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined at two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) and not to exceed two thousand dollars for each day of the violation.
- Section 7. Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances. All parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict only; provided that any and all ordinances providing for penalty if found not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.
- Section 8. Savings Clause. All rights and remedies of the City of Holland, Texas, are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of this ordinance or any other ordinance which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such ordinances, same shall not be affected by this ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.
- Section 9. Severability. If any provision of this ordinance or the application of any provision to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications hereof which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.
- Section 10. Open Meetings. That it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this ordinance is passed was open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter. 551, Loe. Gov<sup>1</sup>t. Code.
  - Section 11. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after



# LOSS HISTORY:

There were no prior losses listed in the file or reported by the insured.

#### CAUSE:

This loss was reported as due to HAIL damage, with a date of loss of 3/23/2025. This assignment was received from your office on 3/28/2025.

A search of the storm reports showed the last hail event occurred on 03/23/2025 which produced hail of 1" with a second date of 04/09/2024 which also produced hail of 1" at the insured location. The wind report shows an event which produced winds of 50mph on 03/04/2025 with the highest wind shown on 04/09/2024 producing winds of 70mph.

# ORIGIN:

The noted damages were limited to the roof and ceilings in two offices and the warehouse.

#### **RISK INFORMATION**

The loss location is located at 104 W Travis Street, Holland, TX 76534.

This is a one-story joisted masonry structure with stone/brick siding and a modified bitumen roof. It was built on a slab on grade foundation in 1920. The building is currently used for the Holland Police Department.

We inspected and photographed the roof. We inspected the low slope roof and parapet walls noting hail damage to the roof covering which appear to be older impacts. We also noted the rooftop a/c and gutter along the rear elevation showed no impact damage or hail spatter marks. The parapet walls were observed to be missing the cap flashings or having flashing which were modified creating openings along the top of the wall. There was not a storm created opening in relation to the interior water damage noted. The age of the roof is unknown but appears to be approximately 20 years old. Due to the lack of sizable hail and hail spatter there is currently no recommendation for repairs or replacement.

Front Elevation: No storm damage noted at the time of the inspection.

Right Elevation: No storm damage noted at the time of the inspection.

Rear Elevation: No storm damage noted at the time of the inspection.

Left Elevation: The left elevation is shared with the neighboring unit.

#### Interior:

Office One – Water stains were noted on the ceiling panels in the office below the low slope roof. There was not a storm related opening to the building roof. There is currently no recommendation for repairs.

Office Two – Office two also showed water stains on the ceiling panels in the office below the low slope roof. There was not a storm related opening to the building roof. There is currently no recommendation for repairs.

<u>Warehouse</u> – The ceiling in the warehouse has several panels missing with water damage noted on the existing panels under the low slope roof. There was not a storm related opening on the roof above this leak area. There is currently no recommendation for repairs.

4/11/25 Revision: We have allowed for repair of the damaged roofing.

**ID 25 - CITY HALL** – Photos were included in the report of the city hall building as it shares a wall with the ID 1 – Police Department. The roof access was also on the City Hall building. There was no storm damage observed or reported to City Hall.
